

Robert Malcolm Feb 15, 1935 – Aug 21, 2015



Robert G. “Bob” Malcolm, 80, of Oak Grove, Mo passed away August 21, 2015. He was born February 15, 1935 in Beulah, KS to Paul and Kathryn (Childers) Malcolm. He graduated high school in Cherokee, KS and was a long-time Kansas City area resident. Bob retired on April 7, 1992 from the Gas Service Company, as a superintendent.

He enjoyed spending time with his family and close friends. In his spare time he also enjoyed fishing and finding new ways to create things. He was a 50 year member of the Masonic Lodge A.F. & A. M.
